Plant of the Month: Paph rothschildianum



Grown by Justin Pepperney

Justin's advice for successfully growing "roths" is to give them a lot of light, water, food, warmth, and humidity. While seedlings can be grown under Phal light, mature plants should be grown in bright light (they can take up to Cattleya light). Justin grows them in small Orchiata bark mixed with a little charcoal and sponge rock. The roots should be kept slightly moist at all times + watering about twice per week, and fed weekly with 1/4 tsp of 30-10-10 orchid food. Seedlings can take up to 10 years to bloom from flask, so they are definitely for more patient growers, but the latest breeding is a little faster growing and easier to bloom.

Instructions for Zoom meeting via Tracy Strombotne

Here is the meeting invitation for Thursday's / April 16 virtual meeting for the Central Ohio Orchid Society! It is scheduled to start at 7:30pm, but feel free to join early if you have never done a zoom meeting before.

If you are joining on a PC, Zoom will want to add some software, so let it do that, and when it comes up with a message at the bottom asking if you want to run the software or save it, choose run. Give yourself an extra few minutes before the start of the meeting to allow the software to install.

If you are joining on a smartphone or tablet, please download the Zoom app before the meeting to expedite your joining the meeting.

If neither of these is available to you, there are phone numbers below you can use to join the teleconference, where you will be able to hear what happens, but not see the presentation or other participants.

For those of you concerned about security, this is a password protected meeting (listed below the meeting link, in most cases you won't need to enter it), and you will be put in a waiting room (just a screen that says waiting room) until you are joined to the conference. This allows us to deny anyone access that is not in the group. Right around 7:30, I will be busy adding people so it may take a few minutes for me to get to you all.

The meeting defaults are for everyone to join with both their video and audio on. If you want to mute either of these you will need to do that on your device. On your PC, these controls are at the bottom of the screen, but only appear when you move your cursor down there, just above the taskbar. You will probably want to mute when you are not speaking, so that if the dog barks or there is other background noise, you won't be preventing others from hearing whoever is speaking at the time. On your PC you can press and hold the spacebar to unmute while you are speaking, so you don't have to keep muting and unmuting yourself.

The good news is, the new website is ready and functioning. Mostly. The less-than-good news is, when Ohio began its Covid-19 lockdown, I not only had to abruptly shift my entire teaching load to online classes (temporarily halting my progress on the site), I was also locked out of my workspace on campus. I lost access to all the software I was using to build the site, and the ability to troubleshoot from multiple computers and browsers to make sure everything is accessible to everyone. The other good news is, I'm highly adaptable, so I was able to make this transition relatively seamlessly, and am back on track.

The link above is a working link. There are, however, more kinks to be ironed out, and more features to be added. I have more SEO (Search Engine Optimization) strategies I need to employ for the site to be easily found on Google, and there are likely errors in spacing and wording that need to be corrected. I wanted to get the link to you all now, though, so you can start looking at the site.

I will be emailing this week further instructions on the site, including how to use one of the site's features, the Member's Forum. This is in the COOS-member only section of the site that requires a login (those of you who are tech-savvy can head on over there now and use it!).

Ideally, all of the new banners, branding, etc. would have been rolled out simultaneously, but with so many changes and cancellations, the brand new banner for the show tables hasn't even been used yet. Though it didn't debut at the Annual Show & Sale, I can show it at the Zoom meeting!

Keeping in mind that this is a work in progress; after you spend some time on the site, I am open to suggestions to what will make it function the best for the society.
