Plant of the Month

Rhyncholaelia glauca grown by Ken Mettler

I've has grown Rhyncholaelia glauca for about 40 years now. I think I have finally figured it out. They don't want to be babied!

This species comes from semi-dry (not quite desert) areas in Mexico and Central America. It enjoys BRIGHT light most of the year. Mine gets moved out into full sun, after a short acclimation period. The foliage will develop a purple cast if it's happy. If it's all green, it's not getting enough light. I water and feed it regularly during the summer. I set the pot on my deck railing with no tray, so it gets very good drainage.

When fall comes, give as much of the dwindling light as possible, and don't be in a hurry to move it indoors. A light frost seems to help with setting buds. I've had plants outside that went down to 28 degrees with no problem. They were very dry. I wouldn't recommend this temperature if they were wet.



How I grow my Rhyncholaelia glauca, continued from Page 1

When it gets really cold, I move the plants into my basement cold room that usually stays between 38-60 degrees. Again, cold helps with setting buds. I have bright LED lighting. They only get a light watering every two weeks. I've talked to a lot of growers with beautiful, green plants that never get below 50 degrees. The plants grow and look great, but seldom bloom.

So, if you can bring yourself to be a little mean to your plants, or at least a bit neglectful, this is an excellent species for you. And the nighttime fragrance of the blooms is second to none!

The next meeting of the Central Ohio Orchid Society will be held on Thursday, April 17, 2025 at Franklin Park Conservatory in the Veridian Room. The beginners corner will start at 6:30 pm, followed by the meeting and presentation at 7 pm. You can get to the Veridian room by entering the front doors of the conservatory and taking the elevator behind the front desk to the second floor. Walk through the second floor (toward the Palm House) to the back and take another elevator (or steps) back to the ground floor and follow signs to the Veridian Room. Don't forget to bring your plants for the monthly Show Table, results will be announced after the presentation.

PHRAGMIDEDIUMS

Jim France purchased his first orchid, a cymbidium, in 1993 after viewing customer's collection. As he tells many a beginner, everyone kills at least one...and so it was promptly drowned. As it happened an orchid show was the following week, and the passion commenced. Jim became a member of an orchid society, and learned from the experts in the group, as well as the many wonderful growers he befriended. Fueled by his interest, Jim began selling in 1996, and established Oakwood Orchids. He dabbled in hybridization and enjoyed the things that were more different than the normal orchids found easily. Jim has grown under lights for 23+ years, and finally with the collection and business growing, established two medium greenhouses.

Jim is past treasurer and president of the Miami Valley Orchid Society; past board member of MAOC shows, and is an AOS judge. The first orchid awarded was Catasetum Hilltop's Dingbat 'Junior', a catasetum named after his grandson. One of his favorites, catasetums, are a part of his collection and he has received two additional awards: Catasetum pileatum 'Leeann' and Catasetum osculatu 'The Boys'. Enjoying a variety of orchids, another early award was for Phragmepedium Seargeant Eric 'Hans', which spurred another part of the collection. Jim has received a total of 25 AOS awards, including the 2019 annual AOS Roy T. Fukumura Vandaceous Award for Robiquetia cerina 'Donna's Treasures' AM/AOS. Orchiata Precision

3-6mm, the smallest chip size used mainly for young orchids or orchids seedlings (from flask).



6-9mm, suits young orchids, a good size for second potting.





Orchiata Power

9-12mm, suits young and mature orchids, a good size for second potting



12–18mm, suits mature orchids and orchids that require more AFP*.





Orchiata Super

18–25mm, our largest chip size, used for mature orchids and orchids that require a high AFP*.

*AFP: Air Filled Porosity or more air space to prevent root rot
