



Plant of the Month

#### Phragmipedium Bel Croute grown by Megan Osika Courtland

I grow my Phrag. Bel Croute mostly indoors in a grow tent, and outside in the warm months on a shaded plant bench. Indoors, I generally keep the temperature 70-80F, and humidity above 60%, with a 6-bulb T5 light fixture about 4 feet above it. I have a small fan in the tent to circulate air as well. Outdoors, my plant bench is in the shade, but will get very bright indirect sun. I protect it from direct sun by placing it just in the shade of my house, as to avoid the noon overhead sun. Its potted in a clear gallon pretzel container, with many drainage holes, but sits in a dish that holds a little water. It's planted in only leca. I water it with aquarium water, enhanced with nitrogen from my axolotls. I let an inch of water sit in the dish, and wait until it has all been used and is almost dry before I water again. I also fertilize with slow release fertilizer pellets from Eric Sauer, who has a specially formula that works best with Phrags. I originally got this plant as a division from Dick Wells, of Hilltop orchids, maybe 15 years ago.

#### Cyprípedíum japonícum Grown by Tennís Maynard

Wins Trophy and CHM/AOS at West Shore Orchid Society Show



A previously awarded Cyp. japonicum appears to have been awarded to a Cyp. formosamum, a closely related species. Having Tennis's plant documented provides AOS with correct information on the species, which will be used in later awards.

Certificate of Horticultural Merit (CHM) Awarded to a cultivar of a species or natural hybrid with outstanding aesthetic appeal, that contributes to the horticultural aspects of orchidology. The entire plant must be presented and should be in good condition and have sufficient flowers to judge the horticultural merit of the plant. This certificate may be awarded more than once if a plant has characteristics significantly desirable and different from other awarded cultivars. A score of 80 points on the Horticultural Merit scale is required

Flower characteristics 36 pts: form (12), color (12), size (12)

Plant characteristics 36 pts: robustness (12), condition (12), floriferousness (12)

Other characteristics 28 pts: Aesthetic appeal (28)

The distinctive features of the cultivar must be clearly described, measurements recorded and the country of origin noted. This award is provisional upon taxonomic verification

#### **ORCHID PEST AND DISEASES**

Our speaker this month will be Fred Bess, presenting information on orchid pests and diseases. Fred has significant practical knowledge of controlling pests in his specialty orchid collections and is also a licensed pest controller. Fred got his start growing orchids from an early age thanks to his grandmother. By trade, he is a certified arborist and horticulturist. Fred has a passion for the rare, hard to grow, and weird! His collection includes such things as Dendrophylax (the Ghost Orchid), a nice collection of other southern Hemisphere terrestrial species, carnivorous plants, and one of the world's most endangered conifers, Torreya taxifolia. All his plants and the conifers are found at his suburban Cleveland home. Fred is also a lover of dogs.




