#### **Edgar Stehli on Tolumnias**

This month we will have a visit from one of the friends of our society, Edgar Stehli of Windswept in Time Orchids. Many of you have probably met Edgar and his wife Kim at of our shows, and he frequently comes to share his incredible orchid knowledge.

Edgar has been fascinated by orchids since first finding a native Ohio orchid near his home at the age of eight. He now grows thousands of orchids in his Cleveland-area greenhouse, and his business specializes in orchids from the Caribbean and Madagascar.

Edgar has earned many AOS awards, and he will share some of his secret growing tips at our meeting. This month he will cover the Equitant Oncidiums known as Tolumnias. These relatives of the "Dancing Ladies" orchids don't take up a lot of space and provide beautiful and colorful flowers!

Edgar will have plants for sale. A short list includes:

Onc. Tsiku Margurite "#1" \$20-25 (a little like Onc. Twinkle)

Some Miltoniopsis \$25-30
